

Newsletter Summer 2023


I simply cannot believe a whole year has gone by since our last newsletter! Time flies when you're having fun!

Next up was Sussex Festival at the beautiful Roedean

School. Tilly placed 3rd in her modern solo and 4th in her character solo and Sophia placed 3rd in her character solo, qualifying for All England Regional Finals next May! Our lovely Intermediate Ballet Group also had the opportunity to perform on the massive stage at The Hawth again and was

placed 2nd. At the end of April, we headed to the unlikely venue of Billingshurt Leisure Centre for a new competition, "South East Stars". We were over the moon to win every classical section! Well done to Emily, Emma, Eva S, Faye, Jemima, Lois, Lucy and Sophia.





After a quieter, calmer May, in June (following Miss Emily's Big Announcement!), we hosted our first ever live examiner at Bury Village Hall. Eva, Faye, Freya, Rosie and Sophie B all took their Primary exam,

Hattie and Jessie - Grade 1, Tilly - Grade 3, and Lois and Lucy – Grade 5. We were delighted that every, single one of them received either Distinction or Merit. Well done everyone! We also had a successful Southampton Festival, with Tilly winning her character solo and qualifying it for All England Regional Finals next May, and Sophia placing 3rd for her character solo. Finally, Tilly received the



astounding news that, following her audition, she has been placed on the Short Waiting List for the Royal Ballet School's Junior Associate programme and, in the meantime, will receive online classes with them! Thousands of children apply for very few spaces so this is a huge achievement; well done Tiny Tilly!

The school year ended in true Boathouse fashion with our Summer Watching Days, followed by the whole school Défilé and Reports Presentation. As always, it was humbling to see Bury Village Hall so full and to reminisce on how far our little ballet school has come in just a few years!





Over the summer, we received more fantastic news from some of our keenest students: Lucy successfully auditioned for English Youth Ballet's production of Coppélia which will be performed at The Hawth in November, and Isla-Rose and Tilly were both offered places on Camille Bracher's "Ballet Base" Associate programme. Isla-Rose also attended her first Summer School at Masters of Ballet Academy in London and loved



every moment. Tilly danced beautifully at Petersfield festival and, finally,

Miss Emily enjoyed one more trip up to Birmingham to see Elisa perform in her Summer Performance. She made her very proud indeed.
